### (Un)Qualified

### Gentle and Lowly

## The One Qualifier for Access to Jesus

28 Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Matthew 11:28 ESV

#### Yoked with Him

29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Matthew 11:29-30 ESV

First, the yoke teaches that we are inadequate.

18 The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; he rescues those whose spirits are crushed. Psalm 34:18 NLT

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. Matthew 5:11 ESV

Second, the yoke teaches that Jesus is adequate.

Third, the yoke teaches that we can measure up With Him.
